

CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE) SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Students in Aquinas' Continuing Education program are typically 23 years and over or are veterans of any age. There are many sources of financial assistance available. Attending Aquinas could cost a lot less than you'd imagine. To fully investigate financial opportunities, please complete a free application for Federal Financial Aid (FAFSA) online at fafsa.gov. (Aquinas' school code is 002239). It is best to complete this process as early as possible.

Scholarships for Adult Students

Ada Business Association Scholarship and Wyoming-Kentwood Area Chamber of Commerce Scholarships

Partial tuition scholarships of 20 percent are available for eligible part-time and full-time employees of organizations who are current members of the Ada Business Association or the Wyoming-Kentwood Area Chamber of Commerce. Awards are made throughout the year.

John F. Donnelly Scholarship

Eligible part-time and full-time employees of participating school districts or corporations are eligible to apply for this partial tuition scholarship. A list of participating organizations is available online. Awards are made throughout the year.

Norbert J. Hruby Scholarship for Community Service/Volunteerism

A selection committee awards this partial tuition scholarship based upon community service/volunteerism. Up to ten scholarships are granted each year. Applications are due in mid-June for the following Fall semester and are due in late November for the following Spring semester.
