Student Code of Conduct Policy 8.30

Decision

On March 12, 2022, the AGC membership voted to approve changes to the Student Code of Conduct Policy as follows:

Rationale

This was a regularly scheduled review of the Student Code of Conduct. This Policy was last reviewed in 2018.

Changes to the revised Policy statement include:

- Updating Title IX definitions, regulations, and procedural requirements to be in compliance.
- Including additional examples and definitions for Academic Dishonesty and Classroom Misconduct.
- Updating definition of Online Classes to include all modalities.
- Changing language to reflect current local, state, and federal laws.
- Editing document for clarity and consistency.

Supporting Data

The team reviewing this policy:

- Benchmarked with Henry Ford CC, Lansing CC, Washtenaw CC and Macomb CC.
- Sought and included input from AGC members at three meetings.
- Received and responded to input from Departments, Programs, and individual faculty members.

Implications for Action

Steps in the approval process for this policy are as follows:

- The Student Code Review Team makes recommendations to AGC.
- AGC reviews with a focus on academically-related pieces, makes recommendations, and endorses.

- The GRCC Policy Review Team reviews, makes recommendations, and approves.
- The GRCC Cabinet/President review, make recommendations, and approve.
